Promoting Competitiveness of the African Cashew Value Chain: The Competitive Cashew initiative (ComCashew)

The Competitive Cashew initiative (ComCashew), formerly known as the African Cashew initiative (ACi), presents a new and innovative model of broad-based multi-stakeholder partnership in development cooperation. ComCashew is a private-public partnership project under the implementation Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) GmbH. ComCashew is funded by the German Federal Ministry of Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ), In collaboration with private and public partners significant progress and impact has been made for over 512,000 farmers and about 40 processing companies. Since its inception, around 530,000 new jobs have been created in Benin, Burkina Faso, Côte d'Ivoire, Ghana, Mozambique and Sierra Leone – 75 per cent in production, 20



per cent in trade and 5 per cent in processing. Income per farmer has increased to EUR 913 compared to EUR 360 in 2009.

Sierra Leone has favorable ecological conditions for cashew cultivation, ranging from a tropical climate with warm temperatures and sunny conditions for many months to a rainy season spanning from April/May to October/November with an annual average rainfall of about 2,746 millimeters (mm). The country offers extensive arable land, the greater proportion of which is either underutilized or not utilized at all. Given this fact, the government has recognized cashew as an alternative cash crop to diversify agriculture and export with the aim of boosting the economy. In 2017, the country recorded its first official export of 75 metric tons of raw cashew nuts.

Baseline Survey under the lead of MAF and in collaboration with other public and private actors; Establishment of 25 nurseries in 11 districts



154 Cashew Mother Tree selected for analysis and future cashew breeding programme

Procurement of 2,600 kg polyclonal seeds from Ghana facilitated and technical support to EU/ProAct (MAF and COOPI) for distribution of 300,000 high yielding seedlings



Capacity development of 36 experts (10 women) through the Regional Master Training Program on Cashew Value Chain in Africa

Ongoing Activities

ComCashew supports the development of the cashew sector in Sierra Leone, on demand basis and in synergy with ongoing activities in the country.

Activities ongoing and suggested for include:

- Advise on policy reform and strategy development - with EU/BAFS and other actors.
- Conducting of Yield Survey and Economic case study with farmers
- Mother tree selection and establish germoplasm, scion bank and clonal gardens
- Continue support to MAF to boost cashew production through nurseries, production and distribution of seedlings and farmer trainings
- Facilitating Sierra Leone's integration into Regional networks (Consultative International Cashew Council - CICC, research network - REDAA, Industry association- ACA, etc.)
