Burkina Faso – Country Report

1.Promoting Competitiveness of the Cashew Value Chain.

The Market Oriented Value Chains for Jobs and Growth in the ECOWAS Region (MOVE-ComCashew) is commissioned by the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ). MOVE-ComCashew is cofinanced by the European Union (EU) under the Samoa agreement with the Organization of African, Caribbean, and Pacific States (OACPS) and by BMZ. MOVE-ComCashew operationalizes component 1 of EU's framework program for support to OACPS members' agriculture value chains development.

The impact of ComCashew since its inception in 2009, recorded 712,000 new jobs created in cashew production, processing, and trade, across project countries and over 790,000 farmers were trained on Good Agricultural Practices (GAP) and Farmer Business School (FBS) from 2009 to 2020 resulting in higher productivity, diversified and higher incomes in implementing countries.



In Burkina Faso over 50,000 households are involved in the cultivation of cashew nuts with their cultivating area stretching over a total of 389,000 hectares as of 2021.

More than **65,000** farmers **(38% women and 22% young people)** benefited from the trainings.

Over **4,000** farmers directly linked to local processors.



210 graduates from the Master Training Programme. **132** men and **78** women.



115 elite mother trees identified16,225 grafted seedlings distributed10 clonal gardens 4 nurseries established.

5. Ongoing Activities

MOVE-ComCashew through its intervention supports the development of conducive business environment for all actors of the cashew value chain. Some activities currently ongoing in Burkina Faso include:

- Follow-up of partners who benefited from the first phase of Matching Grant Fund (MGF) support
- Capacity building activities for stakeholders in the cashew field (FBS, grafting)
- Supporting three (3) rice and cashew entrepreneurs to work with rice and cashew by-products and develop a new product onto the market.
- Conservation Agriculture Training
- Technical advice and support to processing units.
- Policy advice and support to all the actors for the cashew sector development.
- Continuation of activities within the framework of the second phase of MGF support
